The 1964 Eagle's "Cry" was to communicate and cooperate, a/k/a let us know what can be done better and then volunteer to help better the club. The EYC has always been a volunteer run club and my cry to all of you is "Volunteer!" Volunteering is an opportunity to be at the club with friends old and friends new. The Activities Committee, Race Committee, and Regatta Committee spent many hours last whiter in "Correspondence Meetings" analyzing the response from the membership to the fall question naire. It is apparent that the type of vacations the average member takes has changed over the years. Today many members can only spend two or three weeks at Ephraim. View of the dock in 1999


Spring is here and we have water (not ice) around the dock. We are hoping that this means we can get an early start getting all the lifts in the water ready for sailing. We added two new lifts last year and will add one more lift this year. Thank you Steve Sauter for finding another one!


When the lifts go in, we will be moving the Whaler lifts a little closer to the dock so that, when people get off the Whalers, they do not need to step/jump so far to the dock. We will also be giving the lifts a service before they go in the water so that everything is working well. The swim platform will also be put slightly farther away from the dock this year so that it is easier to bring boats to the north side of the dock.

The water level this year should be close to the same as last year, according to the Army Corps of Engineers. The lake will be at 579.07 feet above sea level, which is very close to the long-term average measured from 1918.

There will be some other minor dock improvements this year including, painting the new grates, covering or removing any last pieces of steel that have the potential to scratch boats, and replacing the old crane switch *before* it fails.

The new spigot at the end of the dock will be an improvement for us in 2024, so no excuse for a dirty dock and or boats!





I am sure we are all looking forward to seeing the dock filled with people and boats, ready for a great 2024 season. Looking forward to sitting on the bleachers watching the races, jumping off the dock to cool down, and of course going for a sail.



We are looking forward to a great season of sailing and racing in Flying Scots. For those of you who may be unaware, the Flying Scot Sailing Association (FSSA) and the Flying Scot are in the top five of the best one-design classes according to a US Sailing study.

As a leading one-design class, the Flying Scot offers racing and recreational sailing opportunities. Supported by a strong class, strict class rules, and a quality builder, the Flying Scot retains value and popularity. These attributes make the class strong, create demand, high resale values, a committed community of sailors, and well-attended regattas. The Flying Scot class is one of a few classes retaining a boat builder -- a builder that is dedicated to quality, the class, and building in the USA.

Membership and support of FSSA enables this relationship to succeed. If you have joined or renewed your membership, thank you. If you have not yet renewed or joined, please do, as we all will benefit. (Boat owners should be members; associate memberships are available for crew.) This summer, besides our regular club racing, we'd like to get more people out on the water in Flying Scots. We will be putting together some recreational sailing events (watch for information in EYC's weekly e-mail). All you need to do is know how to sail. If you don't yet know how to sail, please take advantage of sailing lessons at EYC. There are lessons available for all ages and levels. The Flying Scot is a great boat for sailing or racing in beautiful Eagle Harbor.

We also hope to have some sessions where members and staff can learn more about boat maintenance and repair, where crews become skippers and skippers become crew, and where we even offer some short destination sailing.

As we start the season, plan to get your boat out of storage and down to the dock early. Do you need parts? Do you need an upgrade? Do you need assistance? Again, our builder has most parts readily available. Don't wait until the end of the summer. As an aside, when I asked two young men in Dallas why they sailed a Flying Scot, they told me that they couldn't get parts for their other onedesign boat or it would take six months to get parts. So, they bought an older Flying Scot and decided to fix it up. They would call the builder, get advice, and in every instance when they needed a part, they got the response "It will be going out UPS this afternoon." So, if you've had good intentions about getting your Flying Scot back in sailing shape, now is the time to start planning. (There is also lots of good information available on the FSSA website.) And, our wonderful House and Dock Committee has arranged to get a hose down the dock so that we can all have clean boats.


Come to sail, come to learn, come to race, and get out on the water. I look forward to seeing you on the dock!

The EYC Bridge offerings in 2024 will follow the same weekly schedule and format as in previous years. Monday Open Play will begin on June 10 from 1:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Tuesday Couples' Bridge will begin on June 11 at 4:30 p.m. Thursday Open Play will begin on June 13 at 9:30 a.m.


