From the Commodore

As I write this note, March Madness is about to kick off and EYC Spring prep madness is already underway. Your EYC Board of Directors is working on layups, jump balls and three pointers. Thank goodness there is not an ounce of truth to that statement. However, we have been busy hiring an incredible staff, fine tuning lesson offerings, reorganizing the weekly race series, inventorying equipment, revamping the EYC webpage and planning social events/fundraisers all in an effort to make for an amazing 2025 summer.



Over the winter, I stumbled upon a book titled *Tales of Ephraim Waters* written by Malcom D. Vail. This book was published for the EYC's 50th Anniversary in 1956. Mr. Vail writes, "The idea of writing a history of the Ephraim Yacht Club came to me in the first place because of the my great interest in the Club and its development, and because of the happiness it has brought to me over half a century of Ephraim summers and is now bringing to my family who are fourth generation Ephraim lovers."


The book details a charming story for sailors and landlubbers of Ephraim and its water. It outlines the establishment of the EYC and its role as a fundamental pillar of the village of Ephraim. The EYC had some growing pains in its early years, but weathered every storm. Through additions of land, dock and clubhouse, the EYC put down strong roots. Initially, a club of various classes of sailboats, it was decided that the club would have one class of boats for sailboat racing. In 1937, made possible by Warren Davis, Thomas Lord, Chester Tripp, and Malcolm Vail, the Sea Gull Fleet was the first class of EYC boats. Mr Vail writes, "A starting cannon which had been in use at the early part of the century at the Chicago Yacht Club was obtained and



racing took a new and vigorous lease on life. Skippers from eleven to seventy, male and female, set the pattern of "everybody sails". The club adopted with enthusiasm the idea of being a family club with emphasis on the young people. From that day on, mothers and fathers have sat on the dock and on the clubhouse porch, suffering or rejoicing as the fortunes of their young people waxed or waned on the race course. Most of them have agreed that self-reliance, responsibility and sportsmanship developed rapidly under these conditions and are a large part of the dividends for efforts expended in keeping the Club a center of interest for their children.

Today, the EYC's mission and vision statement reflects

and embraces Mr. Vail's hopes.



EYC's Mission ~

Provide outreach programs, equipment and facilities, and funding for sailing education, training, and competition so that students may learn the life skills and values important in being active and productive members of the community.

EYC's Vision ~

Build a sustainable, life enriching sailing education experience that positively impacts the community and reinforces a desire to preserve sailing's Corinthian spirit and values and the Club's rich history of tradition for future generations.

Eighty years later, the EYC proudly has the Flying Scot, Laser, 420, Optimist and RS Terra fleets for lessons and racing. EYC's sailing instruction program is robust and parents still find themselves on the dock or clubhouse porch experiencing the emotions of their parents or grandparents before them as they watch their young people race on Eagle Harbor.

Safety is paramount at EYC. A powerboat fleet to assist races and lessons can be found on the side of the dock on lifts and ready for action, much like broncos in a rough stock pen. The EYC Gala this summer aims to raise funds to update lifts, always striving to improve lesson and race experiences for members. Funds raised in excess of those needed for lifts will be added to EYC's rainy day fund. So please consider donating. All donations are welcome; no amount is too small. Rest assured that every dollar ultimately supports the EYC mission and vision.

Over the years, the EYC Board has learned from those who served before and worked hard to establish reserves

so the EYC can weather storms. Membership dues (which the Board strives to keep low) and lesson fees, for the most part, cover the club's annual operating costs. When EYC needs equipment upgrades or capital improvements, EYC relies on members to step up and donate resources to fund the tasks. Through careful planning and conservative spending, EYC has a rainy day fund which would cover operating expenses for one year. That being said, life is unpredictable and even with our best efforts and planning, it would serve the club to one day have an endowment. An endowment would allow for interest earned on endowed funds to be part of the budget and allow for more scheduled equipment upgrades or dock and house improvements. To start an endowment, EYC would need an angel or a generous well-wisher (a description used by Mr. Vail to describe ones who helped defray expenses with the Clubhouse in 1939). I dare to dream.

EYC's roots are part of the tapestry which is the foundation of Ephraim and over the years when EYC lets out the main sheet, the sail can catch a greater amount of wind power. In doing this, EYC boasts membership from all neighboring towns and villages. EYC has thus established itself as a pillar of Door County. Every member is a part of the living legacy of Ephraim and Door County as a whole.

Serving as your Commodore, I make it a priority to listen. Everyone's connection to the EYC is their own charming story and the ways in which the club is used by members takes many shapes. The multigenerational component of the club is unique. For many, it is a reminder of times which can be more simple in the best ways.




Dock and House Report


As we look forward to another year of fun at the EYC, here are some updates from the dock.

The dock is going to protect itself from boats that try to move it (none have succeeded yet)! The plan is to provide horizontal barriers all around the dock. There will also need to be some repairs done on the wooden strakes that sit inside the corrugated steel wall. Another planned upgrade is the replacement and refurbishing of the remaining boat lifts. We added lifts last year, and this year, all the lifts need a service to make them reliable and easy to use for the season.



Over the next six months, Lake Michigan-Huron water levels are predicted to be 11 to 14 inches below last year's levels, 8 to 9 inches below long term average levels, 42 to 43 inches below record high levels (remember 2020 and water over the dock), and 21 to 24 inches above record low levels.

The team is working hard to get the dock ready and lifts in place as early as possible, so the season can start with sailing, swimming, watching sunsets, and just hanging out in this special part of the world.
